Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. today issued an emergency proclamation for Butte, Lake, Mendocino, Nevada and Orange counties due to the effects of multiple fires, including the Cherokee, LaPorte, Sulphur, Potter, Cascade, Lobo and Canyon fires, which have damaged critical infrastructure, threatened homes and caused the evacuation of residents.

The Governor also requested a Presidential Major Disaster Declaration to support the state and local response to fires burning in Northern California, following the emergency proclamation issued earlier today for Napa, Sonoma and Yuba counties.

Fire remains at 7,500 acres with a jump in containment to 25%, up from 5%.

Weather conditions are favorable with a shift in winds from hot, dry Santa Anas to cooler, more moist ocean breezes.

We continue to monitor winds. Cooler ocean breezes can still drive fire.

But conditions and progress are going well.

No new threats to Anaheim neighborhoods.

But mandatory evacuations remain in place.
