On Monday, Governor Scott issued Executive Order 17-235 declaring a state of emergency in all 67 counties within the State of Florida.

On Tuesday, Governor Scott requested, and President Donald Trump approved, a pre-landfall emergency declaration for the State of Florida in preparation for Hurricane Irma. Evacuation orders have been issued in Monroe County and additional orders are expected as the storm nears the state.

EVACUATION NOTICES/ORDERS

Broward County has issued voluntary evacuations of mobile homes and low-lying areas beginning today.

Collier County has issued voluntary evacuations of Marco Island beginning today.

Monroe County has issued mandatory evacuations for visitors beginning this morning. Mandatory evacuations for residents will begin this evening.

Individuals with special needs started being evacuated from Miami-Dade County this morning.

State offices will close in all 67 Florida counties this Friday in preparation for Hurricane Irma. State offices in Monroe County are closed until further notice. Beginning tomorrow, state offices in Miami-Dade, Broward and Lee Counties will be closed. Prior to Friday's statewide closures, state office closures will follow the direction of county officials and will be announced as they are determined.

State parks in the Florida Keys are currently being evacuated and there is currently one state park closure at Fort Zachary Taylor Historic State Park. Additional park closures in Monroe County are expected today.

Additional evacuations are expected throughout the state. All Floridians should pay close attention to local alerts and follow the directions of local officials.

Address: 954 Abbottsford Road, LaGrange, Georgia 30240. The park is located off GA Highway 109, approximately 10 miles west of Lagrange, GA.

Atlanta Motor Speedway will open its camping facilities free of charge on their unreserved campground facilities to evacuees seeking temporary refuge from the approaching Hurricane Irma. I-16 One-Way Driving Guides

In the event of a mandatory evacuation from coastal Georgia, I-16 eastbound lanes will become “contra-flow lanes,” or reverse lanes. All I-16 lanes will be westbound traffic only from Savannah to west of U.S. 441 in Dublin, a total of 125 miles. Georgia DOT also can “contra flow” other interstates in the case of emergencies.

Ponce, Puerto Rico- September 1, 2017- The American Red Cross Chapter of Puerto Rico today activated its preparedness plan for the trajectory of Hurricane Irma and its possible impact on the island. In addition, the organization urged families to take the necessary steps and prepare their family plan.

As part of the American Red Cross's preparations, it is: collating materials and equipment, checking the availability of volunteers, and initiating communications with emergency government organizations and agencies. "Just today that begins National Preparedness Month and now that we are in the peak hurricane season, we already have a hurricane threat. Therefore, as we prepare, now is the time for all families to check their supplies and to stock up on the items they need to cope with an emergency," said Lee Vanessa Feliciano, regional executive of the American Red Cross Chapter of Puerto Rico.

The organization has a free application in Spanish called Emergency, available for iPhone and Android, which provides warnings and warnings of hurricanes and other disasters and emergencies. The application also has a button that says "I am secure" which allows the user to send a message through their social networks to indicate that it is out of danger. To download, you should do a search under "Emergency American Red Cross" on the App Store or the Google Play Store for iPhone and Android. Governor Mapp pledged more support for St. John, including evacuation of critically ill patients, additional shipments of diesel fuel for generators, and Coast Guard clearance of ferry boats to resume service.

Confirming that power is in underwater utility cable, Mr. Mapp promised to expedite restoration of electricity in Cruz Bay, initially. He also spoke of the resilience of the residents in St. John, and commended restaurants that have been providing cooked meals free of charge, as well as medical professionals providing patient care without electricity.

Medical Assistance Progress

FEMA Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT) will establish a mobile medical facility outside hospital in St. Thomas. A facility intended for longer use will be established at the rear of the hospital.

Health Commissioner Michelle Davis announced that mental health services are being provided to inmates transferred to St. Croix. Dialysis patients evacuated from St. Thomas are now in St. Croix awaiting transfer.

Thirty inmates were transferred from the St. Thomas correctional facility to Golden Grove on St. Croix. Thirty more are awaiting transfer.

Evacuation of Tourists

Cruise ships are arriving to evacuate 2,000 tourists to the U.S. mainland. Vacated hotel rooms, which are undamaged, may house military and other relief personnel.

Curfew Schedule

The current curfew — 6:00 p.m. to 12 noon daily — will remain in place for the time being.

Public Safety

Governor Mapp appealed to the public to report only “real crimes,” noting that several hoax calls have prompted unnecessary response. Police strength is at 80 percent, according to V.I.P.D. Commissioner Delroy Richards

Federal Assistance

Mr. Mapp confirmed the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) policy, which replenishes benefits for participants enduring power outage of more than four hours. The governor noted, however, that only in the St. Thomas and St. John will modified eligibility requirements extend SNAP benefits to previously ineligible residents.

Status of Schools

Mr. Mapp encouraged families on St. Thomas and St. John to consider enrolling students in St. Croix public schools, where family or other support systems exist. Teachers and support staff in St. Thomas and St. John will be given opportunity to work in St. Croix district.
